在2022年10月15日星期六，列治文的合資格選民將會選出一位市長、八位市議員和七位學務委員。在2022年10月當選的官員任期為四年。

自COVID-19疫情大流行開始以來，卑詩省為了滿足社區的民主利益，已安全地舉行過選舉和補選。在列治文2022年市選，選民、候選人、候選人代表及選舉工作人員的安全，將繼續是至為重要的。當局將會落實一項詳細的“安全選舉——防止傳染病計劃” (Election Communicable Disease Plan)，以確保會有一個安全的選舉。

您合資格投票嗎？

您如符合以下條件，就可以作為居住選民 (resident elector) 來投票：

- 是加拿大公民
- 在全民投票日 (2022年10月15日星期六) 是18歲或以上
- 是列治文居民
- 在登記投票之前在卑詩省居住了至少六個月 (如在全民投票日登記，則2022年4月14日是符合居住要求的最後一天)
- 在法律上沒有被取消投票資格

您如符合以下條件，就可以作為非居住物業選民 (non-resident property elector) 來投票：

- 是加拿大公民
- 在全民投票日 (2022年10月15日星期六) 是18歲或以上
- 不是列治文居民
- 在登記投票之前個人在列治文擁有物業至少30天 (如在全民投票日登記，則2022年9月14日是符合本地物業擁有權要求的最後一天)。您的物業不能由公司、商業機構或團體全部或共同擁有。
- 在登記投票之前在卑詩省居住了至少六個月 (如在全民投票日登記，則2022年4月14日是符合居住要求的最後一天)
- 在法律上沒有被取消投票資格

如果您是非居住物業選民，想了解詳情，請聯絡列治文選舉辦公室 (Richmond Elections Office) (請看本選民指南的最後一頁)。每次選舉您都必須重新登記才可投票。

如何登記投票？

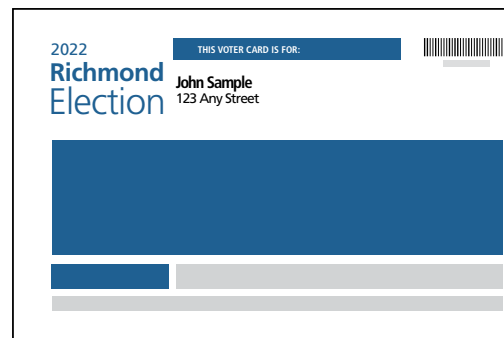

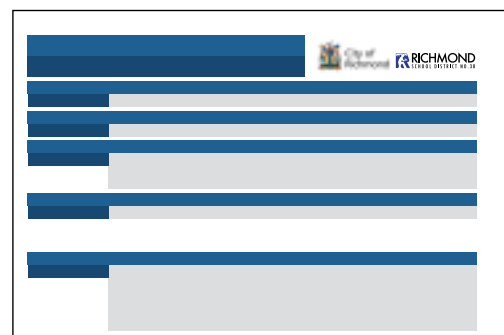

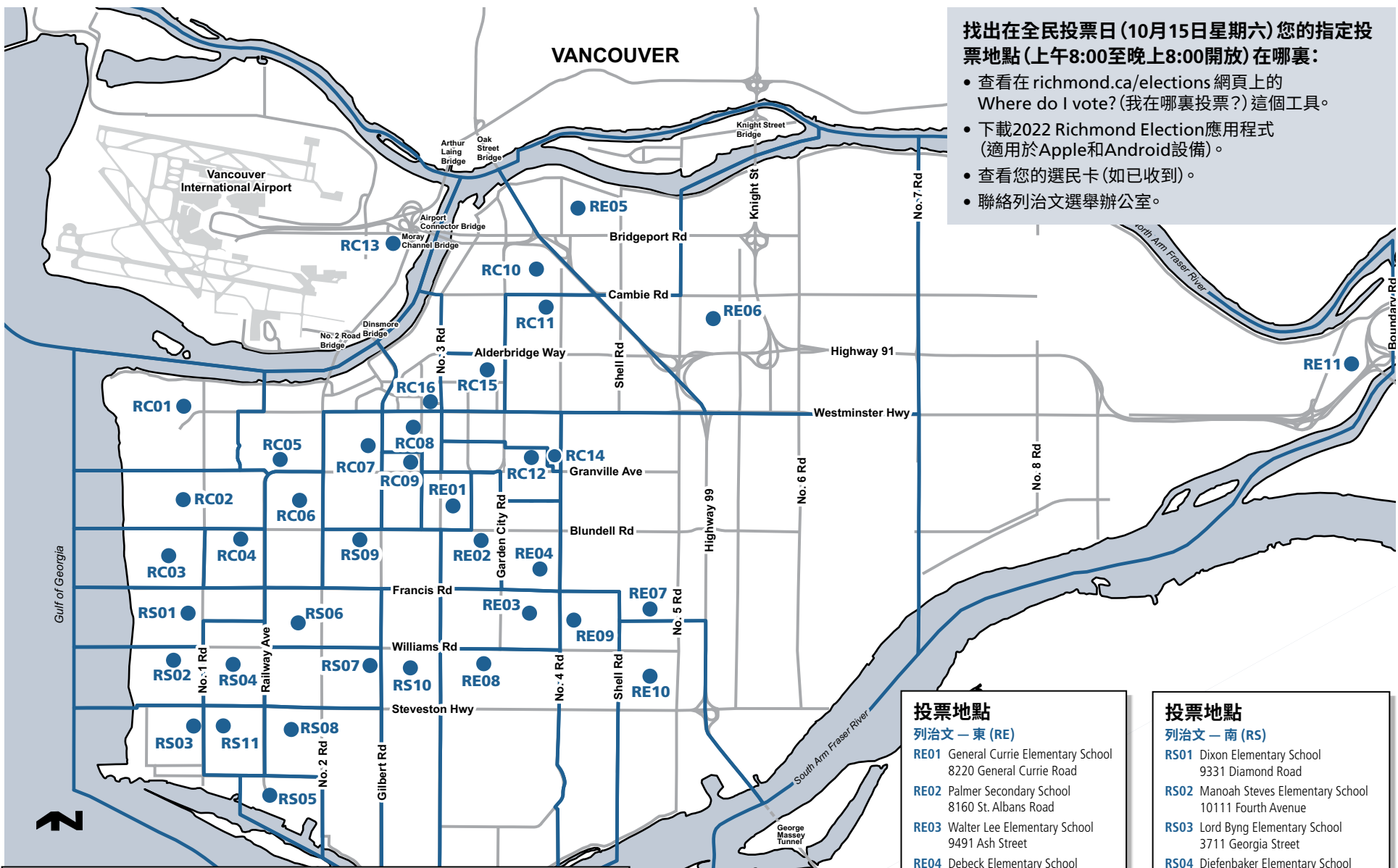

3. 郵寄選票

所有現有選民和新登記者都可索取郵寄選票套件，裏面包含有關如何填寫和交回郵寄選票的說明。郵寄選票的申請將於2022年9月7日星期三開始，**直至2022年10月7日星期五下午3:00為止。郵寄選票套件將會經由加拿郵務公司 (Canada Post) 寄出，直至2022年10月5日。**過了這個日期，選民將會被要求前往列治文市政廳 (Richmond City Hall) 領取郵寄選票套件。

如果您是有殘障、患病及/或受了可能影響投票能力的傷，您可以：

- 帶朋友或家人來協助您在投票間閱讀或填寫選票。他們必須鄭重聲明，將會如實地和公正地協助您。
- 要求通過郵寄選票來投票。通過郵寄選票來投票的申請必須盡快收到，但最遲可在2022年10月7日星期五下午3:00之前。
- 要求使用列治文市政廳在各個提前投票日可提供的無障礙填寫選票器材。這個選項讓您可以通過使用觸控式屏幕、盲文、搖桿器材、吸吹式器材及/或口述影像，來獨力填寫選票。
- 要求在投票地點進行路邊投票。我們鼓勵您在快要到達您的投票地點之前，致電選舉辦公室，電話：604-276-4100。

我們努力確保投票地點是可讓使用輪椅、助行架及代步車的人士進入；不過，有些地點未能做到完全無障礙。我們將確保，在未能做到完全無障礙的投票地點，路邊投票是有清楚標示的。

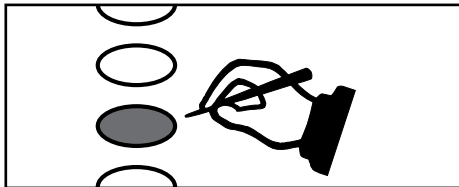

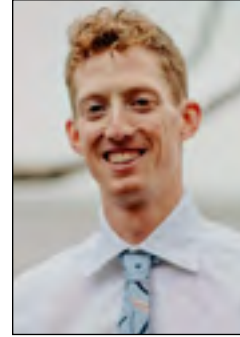
