访问 richmond.ca/elections 或下载 "2022 Richmond Election"移动应 用,让选举信息触手可及。

2022年10月15日星期六,列治文符合选举条件的选民将选举一名市长、 八名议员和七名学务委员。于2022年胜选的候选人将任职四年。

自COVID-19疫情开始以来,不列颠哥伦比亚省(即BC省)的选举和补选都以 安全的方式举行,以满足社区的民主利益要求。对于2022年的列治文选举, 选民、候选人、候选人代表和选举工作人员的安全仍是工作的重点。选举期 间详细的传染病预防计划将制定出台,以确保选举的安全进行。

您有资格投票吗?

如果您符合以下条件,您可以作为居民选民来投票:

- 是加拿大公民
- 在全民投票日(2022年10月15日星期六)已年满18岁
- 是列治文居民
- 在登记投票前已在不列颠哥伦比亚省(即BC省)居住至少六个月(如果 在全民投票日登记,2022年4月14日则是满足居住要求的最后一天)
- 您没有依法被取消投票资格

如果您符合以下条件,您可以作为非居民业主选民来投票:

- 是加拿大公民
- 在全民投票日(2022年10月15日星期六)已年满18岁
- 不是列治文居民
- 在登记投票之前,个人已在列治文拥有房产至少30天(如果在全民投票日登记,2022年9月14日则是满足本地物业拥有权要求的最后一天)。您的物业不能由公司、企业或组织全资或共同拥有。
- 在登记投票前已在BC省居住至少六个月(如果在全民投票日登 记,2022年4月14日是满足居住要求的最后一天)
- 您没有依法被取消投票资格

如果您是非居民业主选民,请联系列治文选举事务处(Richmond Elections Office)了解更多信息(请参阅本《选民指南》的最后一页)。每次选举您都必须重新登记才能投票。

怎样登记投票?

首先,确定您是否已为在2022年列治文选举而登记:

- 登录网站richmond.ca/elections,通过搜索工具 "Am I on the Voters List?"看看自己是否在选民名单上
- 查看"2022 Richmond Election"移动应用(适用于苹果和安卓设备)

如果您尚未登记投票,您可以亲自到某个提前投票点登记,也可以在全民投 票日在您的投票点登记。请携带至少两张有效身份证件。

如果您是非居民业主选民,请联系列治文选举事务处。

登记需要哪些身份证件?

如果您要登记投票,您必须提供两个身份证件,其中要包括您的姓名和居住 地址。其中一个身份证件必须有您的签名。






选民卡样例

有三种投票途径:

1. 在全民投票日投票

您可于2022年10月15日星期六上午8:00至晚上8:00在为您指定的投票点投票。访问 richmond.ca/elections 或下载 "Richmond Election"移动应用 (适用于苹果和安卓设备),找到自己的投票点,或联系列治文选举事务处。如果您收到了邮寄的选民卡,上面也会显示您的投票点。

2. 在提前投票日投票

3. 邮寄选票

所有现有选民以及新登记的选民都可以申请邮寄选票文件包。邮寄的选票 文件包中将包含有关如何填写和回邮选票的说明。邮寄选票将于2022年9月 7日星期三开放申请,截止时间是2022年10月7日星期五下午3:00。邮寄选 票文件包将通过加拿大邮政寄出,直到2022年10月5日。在此日期之后,将要 求选民在列治文市政厅领取邮寄选票文件包。

如果您有残障、病患和/或可能影响您投票能力的伤残,您可以:

- 带一位朋友或家人来,在投票处协助您浏览或填写选票。他们必须郑重 声明,将忠实、公正地为您提供协助。
- **要求通过邮寄选票来投票。**必须确保工作人员尽快收到邮寄选票的申请,但不得迟于2022年10月7日星期五下午3:00。
- 在提前投票日要求使用列治文市政厅提供的无障碍选票填写设备。您可以使用触摸屏、盲文、脚踏选择器、吹吸装置(sip and puff device)和/或语音描述器来帮助填写您的选票。
- **要求在投票点进行路边投票。**我们建议您在快到达投票点之前致电选 举事务处:604-276-4100。

尽管我们努力确保使用轮椅、助行器和代步车的人可以进入投票点;但有些 投票点无法做到完全无障碍。在无法做到完全无障碍的投票点,我们会确保 提供清晰的路边投票标志。




